#### A broken world in need of disciples of Jesus

On behalf of the global church, Langham is grateful for the care First Presbyterian Church of Evanston has shown to our brothers and sisters in Christ around the world. #### A Global Need: Leaders Who Multiply Disciples



As a faithful partner of Langham, you know better than most how the church around the world—especially in hard places—is growing rapidly. You know that across regions like Latin America, Asia, Africa, and the Middle East—roughly 80% of pastors and leaders lack the biblical training and resources they need to shepherd their people faithfully. Without adequate training, these pastors are challenged to multiply disciples of Jesus with grounding in God's Word. As a result, congregations and communities remain unable to biblically respond to hard realities like poverty, injustice, persecution, and pandemics (like the one we are in now).

But, your faithful prayers and generous support of Langham are helping to change that. (THANK YOU!) Over the years, you've come alongside the global church to equip and resource transformational leaders - disciples of Jesus - who impact nations:



You helped equip theological leaders like Dr. Stephen Lee, who multiplies pastors and biblical leaders at the seminary he leads in Hong Kong. Former student Catherine (at left) now leads a holistic urban ministry and says her studies under Dr. Lee prepared her to bring the Gospel to the neediest in Hong Kong. She says, "When I study Scripture, I am so touched by the heart of the Lord for the poor, for the marginalized."



You put study resources, like the South Asia Bible Commentary, into the hands of pastors, leaders and believers across South Asia — helping them faithfully study and share God's Word in their culture and context. One of the editors, Langham Scholar Jacob Cherian (pictured with the commentary), gave the book to a church planter in India who found it so useful, he exclaimed, "This is like a mini Bible school!"

In more than 130+ nations where Langham serves, because of your generosity, trained leaders are on the ground and providing biblical care as they point their people toward Jesus. Weekly we receive updates from around the world about other Langham-equipped leaders who are growing God's kingdom, even in the midst of COVID-19:

- <u>The Bosnian evangelist</u> sharing the Gospel over podcasts, and the Colombian pastor posting faithful Bible teaching online
- <u>The Pakistani leader</u> running an outreach from his seminary to feed and care for the most vulnerable
- <u>The Filipino writer</u> authoring devotionals on suffering with hope

- **Support dozens of global pastor trainers** who shepherd local pastors with ongoing training, adapting in many cases to deliver their training over virtual platforms in places like India, Romania, Indonesia, Colombia and Lesotho. (\*Langham-trained pastors multiply disciples who love like Jesus with 96% witnessing congregations caring for and serving neighbors after sermons.)
